Coronavirus 2019 (COVID-19) Situation Update

March 10, 2021 0600

- The weekly testing rate is lower than it has been since May of 2020 for Miami County and since March of 2020 for the state, as a whole.
- Since the week of February 7, 2021, our statewide weekly percentage positivity has been <5%, which hasn't been <5 since March and May of 2020.
- The last two weeks our % positivity rate has been around 4%
- Our daily case rate as a state and as a county has been steadily decreasing over the last several weeks
- Our hospital admission rate has been decreasing over the last several weeks as a state and county and staying steady over the last couple of weeks
- The number of new deaths by date of death has been steadily decreasing as a state and as a county
- Routing the majority of all new cases to KDHE to focus on vaccine distribution efforts
- No new clusters or outbreaks identified within the last week

Coronavirus 2019 (COVID-19) Vaccine Distribution Update

March 10, 2021 0600

As of 03/09/2021:

- MCHD has received a total of 5,800 doses (first and second-doses, combined) of Moderna COVID-19 vaccine allocated from KDHE and community partners
- 21 first and second-dose clinics have been completed since January 2021, and 25 upcoming clinics are scheduled through April 2021. (MCHD staff are currently scheduling for 3/17/21 first-dose clinic) and we are still in Phase II of the Kansas Vaccination Plan
- 16% of Kansans have been vaccinated thus far, with one dose
- A total of 698, 670 first and second doses have been administered in Kansas
- MCHD has administered a total of 3,085 first-doses and 1,099 second-doses to the following age groups with corresponding percentages:
 - Age Group:
 - 65+: approximately 56%
 - 45-64: approximately 24%
 - 25-44: approximately 17%
 - 18-24: approximately 3%
- MCHD has reallocated 1,560 doses to Auburn, Vohs and Auten pharmacies to assist with mass vaccination efforts with Miami County schools, childcare providers and a residential facility
- The COVID-19 vaccine interest form is still active and new responses are being recorded daily
- Approximately 5200 submissions have been collected as of 3/9/21; once recorded either via online or by telephone submission and additional vaccine appointments become available, MCHD staff are calling individuals to offer a vaccine appointment for a specific time/date/location for an upcoming clinic. MCHD has attempted to contact/schedule all those 65+ who have completed the interest form; currently working on scheduling other Phase I & II recipients by profession
