If you, or someone you know is homebound and unable to travel to receive the vaccine, we want to hear from you! Plans are currently underway to reach the transient populations as well as the homebound population. Please call us at 913-294-2431 and we will record your information and call back once vaccine becomes available to schedule a time for vaccination; or, you can email covidmchd@miamicountyks.org with the information.

Miami County Health Department is planning to host a drive-through vaccination clinic at the Miami County Fairgrounds for Johnson & Johnson vaccine on March 31, 2021. The vaccine will be administered on a first-come, first-served basis until we reach 250 vaccines administered for those eligible in Phases 1-4 of the Kansas Vaccine Distribution Plan. Individuals wishing to receive the vaccine are encouraged to visit “dispenseassist.net” to fill out the “COVID-19 Voucher”, print it and bring it with them. For those who don’t have access to a computer and/or printer, we will have a COVID-19 Vaccine Consent Form to fill out upon arrival. The vaccine clinic will begin at 0800 and individuals must be observed in their vehicle for 15 minutes following the vaccine administration.



Coronavirus 2019 (COVID-19) Vaccine Distribution Update

March 24, 2021 1230

As of 03/23/2021:

- MCHD has received a total of 7,500 doses (first and second-doses, combined) of Moderna COVID-19 vaccine allocated from KDHE and community partners
- 31 first and second-dose clinics have been completed since January 2021, and 22 upcoming clinics are scheduled through May 2021. (MCHD staff are currently scheduling for 4/1/21 first-dose clinic) and we are currently vaccinating Phases 1-4 of the Kansas Vaccination Plan
- 23.2% of Kansans have been vaccinated thus far, with one dose
- A total of 1,352,330 first and second doses have been administered in Kansas
- MCHD has administered a total of 3,794 first-doses and 2,463 second-doses to the following age groups with corresponding percentages:
 - Age Group:
 - 65+: approximately 54%
 - 45-64: approximately 27%
 - 25-44: approximately 16%
 - 18-24: approximately 3%
- MCHD has reallocated 1,700 doses to Auburn, Vohs and Auten pharmacies to assist with mass vaccination efforts with Miami County schools, childcare providers, residential facilities, large organizations and individuals who qualify within the Kansas Vaccination Plan.
 - Auburn, Vohs and Auten have administered a total of:
 - 1,138 first doses of Moderna vaccine
 - 635 second doses Moderna vaccine
 - 304 Johnson and Johnson one-dose vaccine

- The COVID-19 vaccine interest form is still active and new responses are being recorded daily
 - Approximately 6,700 submissions have been collected as of 3/23/21; once recorded either via online or by telephone submission and additional vaccine appointments become available, MCHD staff are calling individuals to offer a vaccine appointment for a specific time/date/location for an upcoming clinic.
